Today:


- Grass-Finishing Beef, Pastured, grain-finished Lamb,

It took 6 guys and one poly wire around them, 30 mins for 2 miles- record time! Let Calving 2016 Begin!






We slide a 8' tall PVC pipe onto a steel T-post to make "gates" from the water alley.





Always have more power than you think you need!








Had a helpful little owl assisting with bull drop off for Edie Creek Angus Bulls on their way to Savona, BC with H.S. Knills trucking

June 1st Cows and calves can finally start Grazing grass for the year.

Good thing they're getting small paddocks, otherwise the 2017 Sale Bulls might get lost in that 6.5'+ clover!




After a few moves it looks like this! It took 27 days for 55 yearling Bulls to graze 20 acres (daily moves)

Found this Monarch butterfly hiding from the 50km wind gusts in our Alfalfa/grass pasture!











3rd cycle on the Purebred cows goes to the Fleckvieh bull. Increase the fertility of the herd by only keeping purebred replacements from first 42 days






Bit of a purple haze coming up through our organic wheat. Hairy vetch, alsike & sweet clover companion crops.


Mid December cows start bale grazing. No tractors start for them. They bed and feed them selves, while spreading manure every day. Seriously improving the land.






String comes off best before it freezes on, but you can always use your snowmobile!
